

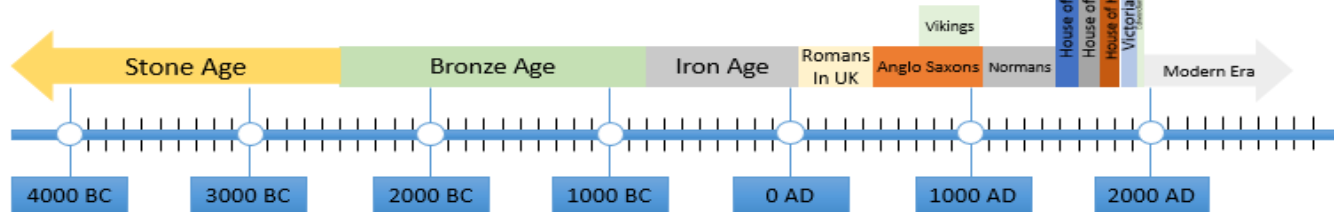

The Stone Age: Farming

Called the Stone Age because of the Stone tools humans used during this time.

Agriculture



Stone Age tools



The beginning of agriculture, where cows, sheep and other animals were farmed to provide a supply of meat, milk, wool, leather and bone.

Skara Brae



A collection of 8 Stone Age houses, containing a fire pit, stone shelves and passageways to protect against the outside.

The Bronze Age: Farming

Called the Bronze Age because of the invention of bronze by smelting copper and tin.

Alloys



When humans discovered how to get metals out of rocks they learnt that combining two metals together made it stronger.

Equipment



Humans could now build better farming equipment that lasted longer. They also made weapons, jewellery and armour.
