Key Facts:

- Global unemployment increased from 170 million in 2007 to nearly 202 million in 2012, of which about 75 million are young women and men.
- Nearly 2.2 billion people live below the poverty line and poverty eradication is only possible through stable and well-paid jobs.
- 470 million jobs are needed globally for new entrants to the labour market between 2016 and 2030.
- Industrial processing and manufacturing are the most critical for the early stages of industrialisation and are typically the largest job creators. They make up over 90% of business worldwide and account for between 50-60% of employment.

- To know about the distribution of formal employment, informal employment, & unemployment in different world regions or nations, & which social groups are especially affected by unemployment.
