Prior Learning (What we already know?):

- To locate counties and cities within the UK on a map
- Identify and understand different land and building use in the local area and the UK

Key Questions:

In your own words, what is a continent?

How is a country related to a continent? Where is education poor globally?

What differences exist between different peoples learning?

How does the education in a school in Kenya compare to the education that we have?

What solutions would you suggest to improve education in other parts of the world? To improve it globally?

Key Facts:

There are seven continents: Antarctica, Africa, North America, South America, Australasia, Europe, Asia.

Africa is the second biggest continent, after Asia, with 54 countries within it – including Kenya and Malawi.

India, Pakistan and Iraq are all located in Asia.

Lack of resources, teachers, poor working conditions and overcrowding of classroom are just a few of the reasons why the quality of education is poorer than in the UK.
