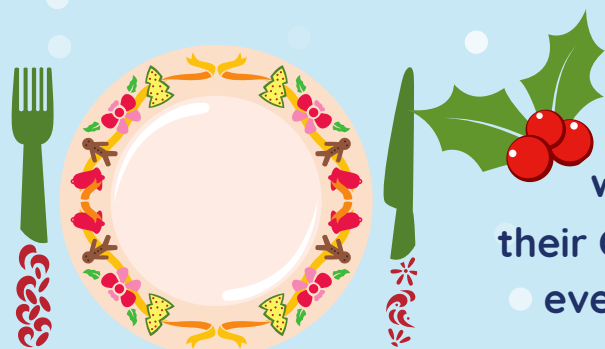
We look forward to seeing you on the first day of Spring Term on Wednesday 3rd January 2024!
