At the end of last term, Year 3 were very fortunate to have two guest speakers as part of our 'Careers Related Learning' programme.

Mrs Parry gave the children an excellent presentation explaining what it's like to be a town planner. The children were able to link their SDG 'Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure' to the challenges of designing and building a new town. We learnt about new innovations implemented in Eddington that include, lake water being used to flush toilets and how bags of rubbish are put down chutes in the street and stored underground before being collected.



Our second speaker, Mr Trattner, explained brilliantly how the diverse role of an engineer could include designing anything from a clip on the side of a solar panel to a race car or a missile guidance system! Interestingly, Mr Trattner told the children that the two most important subjects for his job are maths and English to ensure his work is accurate and well communicated.

We are very grateful to Mrs Parry and Mr Trattner for giving up their time and we would welcome any other parents or carers into school who are willing to explain their careers to our children.

We would also really appreciate it if the balances on children's school dinners (Years 3 to 6) are paid regularly and kept up to date. Thank you for your co-operation.






As we start the new term, please check your child's pencil case and make sure they have the items below, this only applies to all children from Year 2 to Year 6.

- A small pencil case
- A HB pencil
- A pencil sharpener
- A ruler
- A glue Stick
- Coloured Pencils – should include purple & orange for editing as well as blue, red and green for science.
- A blue fine tip handwriting pen (once your child has a pen pass)
- Highlighters
- A black whiteboard marker
- Earphones with 3.5mm jack for use with laptops and I pads
