The two Year 5 teams were positioned 9th and 45th out of 55 teams, and out of the 65 Year 6 teams we positioned 24th and 1st!!!!

Our Year 6 A Team: Iris, Max, Charlie and Lucas, all worked brilliantly together, running as hard and as fast as they could. All of their hard work paid off when



they crossed the line in First Position! Not only did they get 1st place they also achieved a new track record of 15m 35 secs. The event has been running for over 20 years, making this even more of an amazing achievement.

All the children received medals, and a trophy was presented to the winning team by Beth Tweddle, Olympic Gymnast!
